Motion Passed 5-0


3. Consider and approve renting 6 port-a-ports for the Heritage Festival down town. Dunn motioned to approve and was seconded by Rogers.

Motion Passed 5-0


Departmental reports were given by City Administrator Marley, Chief Hammonds and Secretary Jordan.
